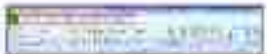

One way to approximate this area is to divide the region into many thin vertical strips. Each strip has a width of Δx . The area of each strip is approximately $f(x_i) \Delta x$, where x_i is the x-coordinate of the center of the strip. The total area is then the sum of the areas of all the strips.



Free-Induction Decay (FID)

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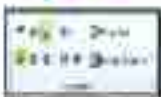

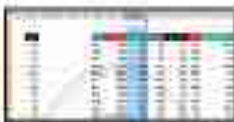

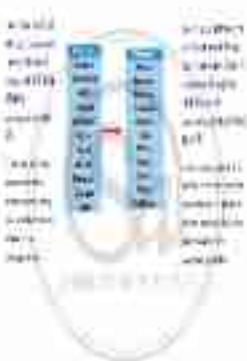

Figure 1: Scatter plot showing the relationship between hours worked and hours spent on household chores.

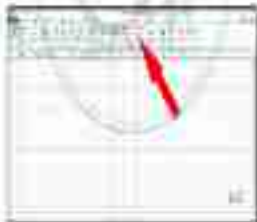

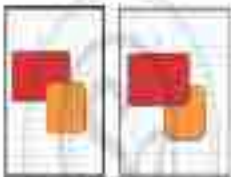
